




As ... As

We use as ... as to say two things are equal or the same. We use as + adjective + as with nouns.

- London is as big as Paris.
- I'm as old as Jim.





We use (not) as ... as to say two things are not the same.

• I'm **not as old as** Sarah. Sarah's 13. I'm 12.

When a pronoun follows as ... as, we use the object form.

- Jim is as old as me.
- I'm as fast as them.

We can also use as ... as to compare gerunds (-ing).

- Running is as good as jogging.
- Dancing isn't as popular as swimming.
